02. Interested bidders may obtain further information from the office of the Controller of Stores & Purchase, Indian Institute of Chemical Technology, Tarnaka, Uppal Road, Hyderabad - 500 007, Telangana, India.
03. A set of bid document can be purchased by any interested bidder on submission of a written application to the above office and upon payment of a non-refundable and non-transferable fee of Rs. 300/- in the form of a Demand Draft in favour of “The Director, CSIR-Indian Institute of Chemical Technology”, payable at Hyderabad during office hours on all the working days up to the due date either in person or by post. As an alternative, the bidding documents can be downloaded directly from our website www.iictindia.org at free of cost. **The bids must reach this office on or before 17/01/2017, up to 13 00 hrs. (IST) and shall be opened on 17/01/2017 at 14 30 hrs. (IST).**
04. **A pre- bid conference for the above equipment shall be held on 04/01/2017 at 11:00 AM. Bidders desirous to attend the pre-bid conference must send their consent along with the list of questionnaire so as to reach the undersigned before 03/01/2017 in order to make the pre-bid conference fruitful.** The amendments to the specification etc pursuant to the pre-bid conference shall be uploaded at www.iictindia.org and shall form a part of the bidding document.
05. The bids must be accompanied by a bid security as specified above and must be delivered to the above office as per the above date and time. Bids will be opened in the presence of Bidders’ authorised representatives who choose to attend on the specified date and time. In the event of the date specified for bid receipt and opening being declared as a closed holiday for purchaser’s office, the due date for submission of bids and opening of bids will be the following working day at the appointed time.
06. The Director, CSIR-Indian Institute of Chemical Technology, Hyderabad reserves the right to accept any or all the tenders either in part or in full or to split the order without assigning any reasons there for.

A. Introduction

1.1. Eligible Bidders

- 1.1.1 This invitation for Bids is open to all manufacturers, Indian agents of foreign manufacturers and their authorised distributors.
- 1.1.2 Bidders should not be associated, or have been associated in the past, directly or indirectly, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the Purchaser to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods to be purchased under this invitation of bids.
- 1.1.3 Bidders who have been blacklisted/suspended by the purchaser are ineligible to quote. The quotes of such firms shall be summarily rejected.

1.2 Cost of the Bid

- 1.2.1 The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its bid, and “the Purchaser”, will in no case be responsible or liable for these costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.

1.3 Fraud and corruption

- 1.3.1 The purchaser requires that the bidders, suppliers and contractors observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of such contracts. In pursuit of this policy, the following are defined:

“Corrupt practice”, means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution;

“Fraudulent practice”, means a misrepresentation or omission of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract;

“Collusive practice”, means an arrangement between two or more bidders, with or without the knowledge of the purchaser, designed to establish bid prices at artificial, non competitive levels; and

“Coercive practice”, means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the procurement process or affect the execution of a contract.

- 1.3.2 The purchaser will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the Bidder recommended for award has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive or coercive practices in competing for the Contract in question.

B The Bidding Document

1.4 Cost of the Bid Document

- 1.4.1 Interested eligible bidders may purchase the bidding documents on payment of the cost of bid document as indicated in the invitation for bids/NIT or alternatively, the bidding documents can be downloaded from our website as indicated in the invitation for Bids/NIT free of cost.

1.5 Contents of the Bid Document

- 1.5.1 The goods required, bidding procedures and contract terms are prescribed in the bidding documents which should be read in conjunction. The bidding documents, apart from the invitation for bids have been divided into 8 (eight) chapters as under:

- Chapter 1: Instructions to Bidder (ITB)
- Chapter 2: General Conditions of Contract (GCC) and Special Conditions of Contract (SCC)
- Chapter 3: Schedule of Requirements
- Chapter 4: Specifications and Allied Technical Details
- Chapter 5: Price Schedule Forms
- Chapter 6: Qualification requirements
- Chapter 7: Contract Form
- Chapter 8: Other Standard Forms comprising:
 - (a) Bidder Information Form
 - (b) Manufacturer's Authorization Form (MAF);
 - (c) Bid Security Form
 - (d) Performance Statement form
 - (e) Deviation Statement Form;
 - (f) Service Support details;
 - (g) Bid form
 - (h) Performance Security Form;
 - (i) Acceptance Certificate Form
 - (j) Integrity pact

1.5.2 The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms, and specifications in the bidding documents. Failure to furnish the required information as per the bidding document or submission of a bid not substantially responsive to the bidding documents in every respect will be at the Bidder's risk and may result in rejection of the bid.

1.6 Clarification of bidding documents

1.6.1 A prospective bidder requiring any clarification on the bidding document shall contact the Purchaser in writing at the Purchaser's address specified in the Special Conditions of Contract (SCC), latest by the date specified in the Invitation for Bids/NIT. No request for clarification or query shall normally be entertained after the pre-bid conference. Should the Purchaser deem it necessary to amend the bidding document as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under clause pertaining to amendment of bidding documents and clause relating to the deadline for the submission of bids. The clarifications and amendments issued shall be hosted on the website of the Purchaser for the benefit of the other prospective bidders.

1.7 Amendment of Bidding Documents

1.7.1 At any given point of time prior to the deadline for the submission of bids, the Purchaser may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective bidder, modify the bidding documents by amendment. The same would also be hosted on the website of the Purchaser and all prospective bidders are expected to surf the website before submitting their bids to take cognizance of the amendments.

1.7.2 In order to allow prospective bidders' reasonable time in which to take the amendment into account in preparing their bids, the Purchaser, at its discretion, may extend the deadline for the submission of bids and host the changes on the website of the Purchaser.

C. PREPARATION OF BIDS

1.8. Language of Bid

1.8.1 The bid prepared by the bidder, as well as all correspondence and documents pertaining to the bid exchanged by the Bidder and the Purchaser, shall be written in English language only especially when the details are technical. However, if Government of India makes it mandatory under Rajbhasha Adhiniyam, the views of Rajbhasha unit of CSIR may be sought.

1.8.2 The Supplier shall bear all costs of translation, if any, to the English language and bear all risks of the accuracy of such translation, for documents provided by the Supplier.

1.9. Documents Comprising the Bid

1.9.1 The bid prepared by the Bidder shall include:

- (a) Bidder Information Form; (Technical Bid);
- (b) Bid security as specified in the Invitation to Bids; (Technical Bid);
- (c) Service support details form; (Technical Bid);

- (d) Deviation Statement Form; (Technical Bid);
- (e) Performance Statement Form; (Technical Bid);
- (f) Manufacturer's Authorization Form; (Technical Bid);
- (g) Documentary evidence establishing that the bidder is eligible to bid and is qualified to perform the contract if its bid is accepted; (Technical Bid);
- (h) Bid form; (Price Bid only);
- (i) Documents establishing goods eligibility and conformity to bidding documents; (Technical Bid);
- (j) Applicable Price Schedule Form; (Price Bid only);
- (k) DGS&D Enlistment certificate in case the bidder is submitting the bid on behalf of his/her principal located outside India under the compulsory registration scheme of the Indian agent of the Govt. of India; (Technical Bid);
- (l) Schedule of requirements. (Technical Bid);
- (m) The complete un-priced bid including the details of the proposed solution, make/model of the offered goods, quantity, the terms & conditions etc. (Technical Bid);

1.10. Bid form and price schedule

1.10.1 The bidder shall complete the bid form and the appropriate price schedule form furnished in the bidding documents. These forms must be completed without any alterations to its format and no substitutes shall be accepted. All blank spaces shall be filled in with the information requested. The bid form and the appropriate price schedule form shall be submitted in accordance with Clause 1.18.3 of the bidding documents.

1.11. Bid Prices

1.11.1 The bidder shall indicate on appropriate price schedule form, the unit prices and total bid price of the goods it proposes to supply under the contract.

1.11.2 Prices indicated on the price-schedule form shall be entered separately in the following manner:

(a) For Goods manufactured within India

- (i) The price of the goods quoted Ex-works including taxes already paid.
- (ii) VAT and other taxes like excise duty etc. which will be payable on the goods if the contract is awarded.
- (iii) The charges for inland transportation, insurance and other local services required for delivering the goods at the desired destination as specified in the price schedule

form.

- (iv) The installation, commissioning, cost of spares if any, cost of optional items if any and training charges including any incidental services, if any.

(b) For Goods manufactured abroad

- (i) The price of the goods, quoted on FCA (named place of delivery abroad) or FOB (named port of shipment), as specified in the price schedule form.
- (ii) The charges for insurance and transportation of the goods to the port / place of destination both by Air and Ocean.
- (iii) The agency commission charges, if any.
- (iv) The installation, commissioning, cost of spares if any, cost of optional item(s), if any and training charges including any incidental services, if any.

1.11.3 The terms FOB, FCA, CIF, CIP etc shall be governed by the rules prescribed in the current edition of the Incoterms published by the International Chambers of Commerce, Paris.

1.11.4 Where there is no mention of packing, forwarding, freight, insurance charges, taxes etc. such offers shall be rejected as incomplete.

1.11.5 The price quoted shall remain fixed during the contract period and shall not vary on any account.

1.11.6 All lots and items must be listed and priced separately in the price schedules. If a price schedule shows item(s) listed but not priced, their prices shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other item(s). Item(s) not listed in the price schedule shall be assumed to be not included in the bid.

1.11.7 This Institute is exempted from payment of Customs Duty as per notification No.51/96 – Customs. However, from 1st March 2002 the Government of India has imposed an *ad valorem* Customs Duty of 5% vide Notification 24/2002 – Customs on all imports covered under Notification No.51/96.

Note: All payments due under the contract shall be paid after deduction of statutory levies at source (like ESIC, IT, etc.), wherever applicable.

1.12. Bid Currencies

1.12.1 Prices shall be quoted in Indian rupees for offers received for the supply within India and in freely convertible foreign currency in case of offers received for supply from foreign countries.

1.13. Documents Establishing Bidder's Eligibility and qualifications

1.13.1 The bidder shall furnish, as part of its bid, documents establishing the bidders' eligibility to bid and its qualification to perform the contract if its bid is accepted.

1.13.2 The documentary evidence of the bidders qualification to perform the contract if the bid is accepted shall establish to the purchasers satisfaction that;

- (a) The bidder meets the qualification criteria listed in bidding documents, if any.
- (b) Bidder who doesn't manufacture the goods it offers to supply shall submit Manufacturers' Authorization Form (MAF) using the form specified in the bidding document to demonstrate that it has been duly authorised by the manufacturer of the goods to quote and/or supply the goods.
- (c) In case a bidder is not doing business within India, he shall furnish a certificate to the effect that the bidder is or will be represented by an agent in India equipped and able to carry out the supply, maintenance, repair obligations etc. during the warranty and post warranty period or ensure a mechanism at place for carrying out the supply, maintenance, repair obligations etc. during the warranty and post-warranty period.

1.13.3 Late/Delayed/Conditional tenders shall not be accepted.

1.14. Documents Establishing Goods' Eligibility and Conformity to the Bidding Document

1.14.1 To establish the goods' eligibility, the documentary evidence of the goods and services eligibility shall consist of a statement on the country of origin of the goods and services offered which shall be confirmed by a certificate of origin at the time of shipment.

1.14.2 To establish the conformity of the goods and services to the specifications and schedule of requirements of the bidding document, the documentary evidence of conformity of the goods and services to the bidding documents may be in the form of literature, drawings and data, and shall consist of :

- (a) A detailed description of the essential technical and performance characteristics of the goods;
- (b) A list giving full particulars, including available sources and current prices, of spare parts, special tools, etc., necessary for the proper and continuing functioning of the goods during the warranty period following commencement of the use of the goods by the Purchaser in the Priced-bid; and
- (c) An item-by-item commentary on the Purchaser's Technical Specifications demonstrating substantial responsiveness of the goods and services to those specifications or a statement of deviations and exceptions to the provisions of the Technical Specifications.

1.14.3 For the purpose of commentary to be furnished in pursuant to the above, the Bidder should note that standards for workmanship, material and equipment, designated by the Purchaser in its Technical Specifications are intended to be descriptive only and not restrictive. The Bidder may substitute these in his bid, provided that it demonstrates to the Purchaser's satisfaction that the substitutions ensure substantial equivalence to those designated in the Technical Specifications.

1.15. Bid Security

- 1.15.1 The Bidder should furnish, as part of its bid, a bid security (BS) for an amount as specified in the invitation for bids. In the case of foreign bidders, the BS shall be submitted either by the principal or by the Indian agent and in the case of indigenous bidders; the BS shall be submitted by the manufacturer or their specifically authorised dealer/bidder.
- 1.15.2 The bid security is required to protect the purchaser against the risk of Bidder's conduct, which would warrant the security's forfeiture.
- 1.15.3 The bid security shall be in Indian rupees for offers received for the supply within India and denominated in the currency of the bid or in any freely convertible foreign exchange in the case of offers received for supplies from foreign countries in equivalent Indian rupees. The bid security shall be in one of the following forms at the bidders' option:
- (a) A bank guarantee issued by a Nationalised/Scheduled bank/Foreign bank operating in India in the form provided in the bidding documents and valid for 45 (forty five) days beyond the validity of the bid. In case a bidder desires to submit a BG issued from a foreign bank, then the same should be confirmed by a Nationalised/Scheduled Indian bank preferably having a branch at Hyderabad; or
 - (b) Fixed deposit receipt pledged in favour of the Director, CSIR-IICT, Hyderabad and valid till 45 (forty five) days beyond the validity of the bid.
 - (c) A Banker's cheque or demand draft in favour of the purchaser issued by any Nationalised/Scheduled Indian bank.
- 1.15.4 The bid security shall be payable promptly upon written demand by the purchaser in case the conditions listed in the ITB clause 1.15.11 are invoked.
- 1.15.5 The bid security should be submitted in its original form. Copies shall not be accepted. Bid security submitted by the bidder in different form other than that is provided in the bidding document shall not be accepted.
- 1.15.6 While Bid security (EMD) is a requirement, the Director of the Lab./Inst. may grant exemption of bid security to some specific parties having sound credentials and are of national/international repute. However, the exemption should be obtained prior to the bid submission and attached with the bid.
- 1.15.7 The bid security of unsuccessful bidder shall be returned positively within a period of 30 (thirty) days after the expiration of the period of bid validity or placement of order whichever is later, without any interest.
- 1.15.8 The successful bidder's bid security will be discharged upon the bidder furnishing the performance security, without any interest. Alternatively, the BS could also be adjusted against Performance Security (PS), if it is paid through Demand Draft/Bankers Cheque.

1.15.9 The firms registered with DGS&D, NSIC, Govt. Public Undertakings, Central Autonomous Bodies and with the CSIR Labs./Inst., if any, are exempted from payment of BS provided such registration includes the item they are offering which are manufactured by them and not for selling products manufactured by other companies.

1.15.10 In case a bidder intimates at the time of tender opening in writing that the bid security is kept inside the financial bid, then in such cases, the technical bid of the party would be accepted provisionally till opening of the financial bids with which the party has attached the bid security.

1.15.11 The bid security may be forfeited:

- (a) If a bidder withdraws or amends or modifies or impairs or derogates its bid during the period of bid validity specified by the bidder on the bid form; or
- (b) In case of a successful bidder, if the bidder fails to furnish order acceptance within 15 (fifteen) days of the order or fails to sign the contract and/or fails to furnish Performance Security within 21 (twenty one) days from the date of contract/order.

1.15.12 Whenever the bidder chooses to submit the Bid Security in the form of Bank Guarantee, then he should advise the banker issuing the Bank Guarantee to immediately send by Registered Post (A.D.) an unstamped duplicate copy of the Guarantee directly to the purchaser with a covering letter confirming the issue of BG by them.

1.16. Period of Validity of Bids

1.16.1 Bids shall remain valid for minimum of 120 (one hundred and twenty) days after the date of bid opening prescribed by the Purchaser. A bid valid for a shorter period shall be rejected by the Purchaser as non-responsive.

1.16.2 In exceptional circumstances, the Purchaser may solicit the Bidder's consent to an extension of the period of validity. The request and the responses thereto shall be made in writing (or by cable, telex, fax or e-mail). The bid security provided shall also be suitably extended. A bidder may refuse the request without forfeiting its bid security. A Bidder granting the request will not be required nor permitted to modify its bid.

1.16.3 Bid evaluation will be based on the bid prices without taking into consideration the above corrections.

1.17. Format and Signing of the Bid

1.17.1 The bids may be submitted in single envelop or in two parts as specified in the invitation for bids.

1.17.2 In case the bids are invited on single envelop basis, then the bidder shall prepare two copies of the bid, clearly marking each "Original Bid" and "Copy Bid", as appropriate. In the event of any discrepancy between them, the original shall govern.

- 1.17.3 In case the bid is invited under two-bid system, the Bidder shall submit the bid in two separate parts. One part shall contain Technical bid comprising all documents listed under clause relating to Documents Comprising the Bid excepting bid form and price schedules. The other part shall contain the price-bid comprising bid form and price schedules. The Bidder shall prepare two copies of the bid, clearly marking each “Original Bid” and “Copy Bid”, as appropriate.
- 1.17.4 The original and all copies of the bid shall be typed or written in indelible ink and shall be signed by the Bidder or a person or persons duly authorised to bind the Bidder to the Contract. All pages of the bid, except for un-amended printed literature, shall be initialled by the person or persons signing the bid.
- 1.17.5 Any interlineations, erasures or overwriting shall be valid only if they are initialled by the person or persons signing the bid.

D Submission and sealing of Bids

1.18. Submission, Sealing and Marking of Bids

- 1.18.1 The bidders may submit their duly sealed bids generally by post or by hand.
- 1.18.2 In the case of bids invited on single envelop basis, the Bidders shall seal the original and each copy of the bid in separate inner envelopes, duly marking the envelopes as “original” and “copy”. The envelopes shall then be sealed in an outer envelope.
- 1.18.3 In case of bids invited under two part basis, the Bidder shall seal the un-priced commercial and technical bid comprising the documents as listed in ITB 1.9.1 excepting for h & j and the priced bid in two separate envelopes duly marked as “Technical bid” and “Price bid”. Both the envelopes shall then be sealed in one outer envelope.
- 1.18.4 (a) The inner and outer envelopes shall be addressed to the Controller of Stores & Purchase, Indian Institute of Chemical Technology, Tarnaka, Uppal Road, Hyderabad – 500 007, Telangana and deposited in the Tender box kept in Purchase Section, if delivered by hand.
- (b) Bear the name and address of the bidder, Tender No, due date and a warning “Do not open before _____”, to be completed with the time and date as specified in the invitation for bids.
- 1.18.5 If the outer envelope is not sealed and marked as required above, the Purchaser will assume no responsibility for the bid’s misplacement or premature opening. In such cases, bids received in open condition within the due date and time will be accepted at the risk of the bidder if the same is presented to the Controller of Stores & Purchase before expiry of the due date and time of opening of the bids.
- 1.18.6 Firms submitting bids in a single envelope against the requirement of two-bid system would be considered for further evaluation at the risk and responsibility of the bidder. However, the opened priced bid would be sealed immediately by the Tender Opening Committee without disclosing the price.

1.19. Deadline for Submission of Bids

- 1.19.1 Bids must be received by the Purchaser at the address specified at Clause 1.18.4 (a) not later than the time and date specified there in. In the event of specified date for the submission of the bids being declared a holiday for the Purchaser, the Bids will be received up to the appointed time on the next working day.
- 1.19.2 The Purchaser may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for submission of bids by amending the bid documents in accordance with the clause pertaining to Amendment of Bidding Document in which case all rights and obligations of the Purchaser and Bidders previously subject to the deadline will thereafter be subject to the deadline as extended. All such extensions shall be hoisted at www.iictindia.org and will be a part of the tender.

1.20. Late Bids

- 1.20.1 Any bid received by the Purchaser after the deadline for submission of bids prescribed by the Purchaser will be rejected.
- 1.20.2 Such tenders shall be marked as late and shall not be considered for further evaluation. They shall not be opened and be returned to the bidders in their original envelope without opening.

1.21. Withdrawal, Substitution and Modification of Bids.

- 1.21.1 A Bidder may withdraw, substitute, or modify its bid after it has been submitted by sending a written notice in accordance with ITB Clause 1.18 duly signed by an authorised representative, and shall include a copy of the authorisation in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 1.17.4 (except that no copies of the withdrawal notice are required). The corresponding substitution or modification of the bid must accompany the respective written notice. All notices must be:

(a) Submitted in accordance with ITB Clauses 1.17 and 1.18 (except that withdrawal notices do not require copies), and in addition, the respective envelopes shall be clearly marked “WITHDRAWAL”, “SUBSTITUTION”, or “MODIFICATION”, and

(b) Received by the purchaser prior to the deadline prescribed for submission of bids, in accordance with ITB Clause 1.19.

- 1.21.2 Bids requested to be withdrawn in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 1.21.1 shall be returned unopened to the bidders. No bid may be withdrawn, substituted, or modified in the interval between the deadline for submission of bids and the expiration of the period of bid validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Form or any extension thereof.

E. Opening and Evaluation of Bids

1.22 Opening of Bids by the Purchaser

- 1.22.1 The purchaser will open all bids one at a time in the presence of bidders’ authorised representatives who choose to attend, as per the schedule given in invitation for bids. The bidders’ representatives who are present shall sign the tender opening sheet evidencing their

attendance. In the event of the specified date of bid opening being declared a holiday for the Purchaser, the bids shall be opened at the appointed time and location on the next working day. In two part bidding, the financial bid shall be opened only after the technical evaluation.

- 1.22.2 First, envelopes marked “WITHDRAWAL”, shall be opened and read out and the envelope with the corresponding bid shall not be opened, but returned to the Bidder. No bid withdrawal shall be permitted unless the corresponding withdrawal notice contains a valid authorization to request the withdrawal and is read out at bid opening. Next, envelopes marked “SUBSTITUTION”, shall be opened and read out and exchanged with the corresponding Bid being substituted, and the substituted Bid shall not be opened, but returned to the Bidder. No Bid substitution shall be permitted unless the corresponding substitution notice contains a valid authorization to request the substitution and is read out at bid opening. Envelopes marked “MODIFICATION”, shall be opened and read out with the corresponding Bid. No Bid modification shall be permitted unless the corresponding modification notice contains a valid authorization to request the modification and is read out at Bid opening. Only envelopes that are opened and read out at Bid opening shall be considered further.
- 1.22.3 The bidders’ names, bid modifications or withdrawals, bid prices, discounts, and the presence or absence of requisite bid security and such other details as the Purchaser, at its discretion, may consider appropriate, will be announced at the opening. No bid shall be rejected at bid opening, except for late bid(s). The contents of the bid forms and price schedules would however be announced only at the time of opening of Priced-bids in the case of two-bid system.
- 1.22.4 Bids received late shall not be considered for further evaluation, irrespective of the circumstances.
- 1.22.5 Bidders interested in participating in the bid opening process, should depute their representatives along with an authority letter to be submitted to the purchaser at the time of bid opening.

1.23. Confidentiality

- 1.23.1 Information pertaining to the examination, evaluation, comparison, and post qualification of bids, and recommendation of contract award, shall not be disclosed to bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process until publication of the Contract Award.
- 1.23.2 Any effort by a bidder to influence the purchaser in the examination, evaluation, comparison, and post qualification of the bids or contract award decisions may result in the rejection of their bid.

1.24. Clarification of Bids

- 1.24.1 To assist in the examination, evaluation, comparison and post qualification of the bids, the purchaser may, at its discretion, ask the bidder for a clarification of its bid. The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing and no change in prices or substance of the bid shall be sought, offered or permitted. However, no negotiation shall be held except with the lowest bidder, at the discretion of the purchaser. Any clarification submitted by a bidder in respect to its bid which is not in response to a request by the purchaser shall not be considered.

1.25. Preliminary Examination

1.25.1 The purchaser shall examine the bids to confirm that all documents and technical documentation requested in ITB Clause 1.9 have been provided, and to determine the completeness of each document submitted.

1.25.2 The purchaser shall confirm that the following documents and information have been provided in the Bid. If any of these documents or information is missing, the offer shall be rejected.

(a) Bid Form and Price Schedule, in accordance with ITB Clause 1.10;

(b) All the tenders received will first be scrutinised to see whether the tenders meet the basic requirements as incorporated in the tender enquiry document. The tenders, who do not meet the basic requirements, are to be treated as unresponsive and ignored. The following are some of the important points, for which a tender may be declared as unresponsive and to be ignored, during the initial scrutiny:

(i) The bid is unsigned, late/delayed and/or conditional.

(ii) The bidder is not eligible.

(iii) The bid validity is shorter than the required period.

(iv) The Bidder has quoted for goods manufactured by a different firm without the required authority letter from the proposed manufacturer.

(v) Bidder has not agreed to give the required performance security.

(vi) The goods quoted are sub-standard, not meeting the required specification, etc.

(vii) Against the schedule of requirement (incorporated in the tender enquiry), the bidder has not quoted for the entire requirement as specified in that schedule.

(viii) The bidder has not agreed to some essential condition(s) incorporated in the tender enquiry.

(ix) The bidder has not attached documents in support of the qualification requirements.

(x) No Bid security or bid security in different form.

(xi) Bid received from Indian agent/distributor of a foreign manufacturer and not supported by the DGS&D enlistment certificate under the compulsory enlistment scheme of Govt of India. The Purchaser may accept bids of Indian agents provisionally who have applied for DGS&D enlistment but not received the enlistment certificate. Such bids must have the details of the application made. However the final enlistment certificate must be presented before the opening of commercial bid failing which the bid may be rejected.

1.26 Responsiveness of the bids

1.26.1 Prior to the detailed evaluation, the purchaser will determine the substantial responsiveness of each bid to the bidding documents. For purposes of this clause, a substantive responsive bid is

one, which confirms to all terms and condition of the bidding documents without material deviations, reservations or omissions. A material deviation, reservation or omission is one that:

- (a) Affects in any substantial way the scope, quality, or performance of the goods and related services specified in the contract; or
- (b) Limits in any substantial way, inconsistent with the bidding documents, the purchaser's rights or the bidder's obligations under the contract; or
- (c) If rectified, would unfairly affect the competitive position of other bidders presenting substantially responsive bids.

1.26.2 The purchasers' determination of a bid's responsiveness is to be based on the contents of the bid itself without recourse to extrinsic evidence.

1.26.3 If a bid is not substantially responsive, it will be rejected by the purchaser and may not subsequently be made responsive by the bidder by correction of the material deviation, reservation or omission.

1.27 Non-Conformity, Error and Omission

1.27.1 Provided that a bid is substantially responsive, the purchaser may waive any non-conformities or omissions in the bid that do not constitute a material deviation.

1.27.2 Provided that a bid is substantially responsive, the purchaser may request that the bidder submit the necessary information or documentation, within a reasonable period of time, to rectify non-material non-conformities or omissions in the bid related to documentation requirements. Such omission shall not be related to any aspect of the price of the bid. Failure of the bidder to comply with the request may result in rejection of its bid.

1.27.3 Provided that the bid is substantially responsive, the purchaser shall correct arithmetical errors on the following basis:

(a) if there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the line item total that is obtained by multiplying the unit price by the quantity, the unit price shall prevail and the line item total shall be corrected, unless in the opinion of the Purchaser there is an obvious misplacement of the decimal point in the unit price, in which case the line item total as quoted shall govern and the unit price shall be corrected;

(b) if there is an error in a total corresponding to the addition or subtraction of subtotals, the subtotals shall prevail and the total shall be corrected; and

(c) if there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words shall prevail, unless the amount expressed in words is related to an arithmetic error, in which case the amount in figures shall prevail subject to (a) and (b) above.

1.27.4 Provided that a bid is substantially responsive, the purchaser may request that a bidder may confirm the correctness of arithmetic errors as done by the purchaser within a target date. In case, no reply is received then the bid submitted shall be ignored and its bid security may be forfeited.

1.28 Examination of Terms & Conditions, Technical Evaluation

1.28.1 The Purchaser shall examine the Bid to confirm that all terms and conditions specified in the GCC and the SCC have been accepted by the Bidder without any material deviation or reservation.

1.28.2 The Purchaser shall evaluate the technical aspects of the bid submitted in accordance with ITB Clause 1.14, to confirm that all requirements specified in Schedule of Requirements of the Bidding Documents have been met without any material deviation or reservation.

1.28.3 If, after the examination of the terms and conditions and the technical evaluation, the Purchaser determines that the Bid is not substantially responsive in accordance with ITB Clause 1.26, it shall reject the bid.

1.29 Conversion to Single Currency

1.29.1 To facilitate evaluation and comparison, the purchaser will convert all bid prices expressed in the amounts in various currencies in which the bid prices are payable in Indian rupees at the selling exchange rate established by any bank in India as notified in the newspapers on the date of bid opening in the case of single part bidding and the rates prevalent on the date of opening of the priced bids in the case of two-part bidding. For this purpose, exchange rate notified in www.xe.com or www.rbi.org or any other website could also be used by the purchaser.

1.30 Evaluation and comparison of bids

1.30.1 The purchaser shall evaluate each bid that has been determined, up to this stage of the evaluation, to be substantially responsive. During the technical evaluation, the bidder(s) may be called for a technical discussion/presentation, if required, and shall be asked to present their proposed solution before the committee. Based on the discussion, the committee may decide about the responsiveness of the bid. In case of complex plants & machineries, the committee may after discussion finalise a Bill of Material (BoM) that, may contain the detailed items to be required for the bid which may vary from the original tender. In such an eventuality, all the qualified bidders shall be asked to submit their revised commercial bid as per the BoM. The revised bid shall be checked by the committee and in case the bid is found to be not in accordance with the revised BoM, the same shall be rejected.

1.30.2 The reasons of rejection of the technical bid shall be intimated to the bidders whose bid has been rejected. In case the bidder feels that the rejection of the bid is not done properly, they may represent citing the relevant page nos. of the technical bid already submitted so that a decision can be taken. Please note that no additional document that has not been provided in the technical bid shall be accepted at this stage nor fresh technical evaluation shall be made.

1.30.3 To evaluate a bid, the purchaser shall only use all the factors, methodologies and criteria defined below. No other criteria or methodology shall be permitted.

1.30.4 The bids shall be evaluated on the basis of final landing cost which shall be arrived as under:

For goods manufactured in India

- (i) The price of the goods quoted ex-works including all taxes already paid.
- (ii) VAT and other taxes like excise duty etc., which will be payable on the goods if the contract is awarded.
- (iii) Charges for inland transportation, insurance and other local services required for delivering the goods at the desired destination.
- (iv) The installation, commissioning, cost of spares if any, cost of optional items if any and training charges including any incidental services, if any.

For goods manufactured abroad

- (i) The price of the goods, quoted on FCA (named place of delivery abroad) or FOB (named port of shipment), as specified in the bidding document.
- (ii) The charges for insurance and transportation of the goods to the port/place of destination.
- (iii) The agency commission etc., if any.
- (iv) The installation, commissioning, cost of spares if any, cost of optional items if any and training charges including any incidental services, if any.
- (v) Cost of additional warranty/AMC etc. if asked for.

1.30.5 The comparison between the indigenous and the foreign offers shall be made on FOR destination basis and CIF/CIP basis respectively. However, the CIF/CIP prices quoted by any foreign bidder shall be loaded further as under:

- (a) Towards customs duty and other statutory levies as per applicable rates.
- (b) Towards custom clearance, inland transportation etc. - 2% of the CIF/CIP value.

Note: Where there is no mention of packing, forwarding, freight, insurance charges, taxes etc. such offers shall be rejected as incomplete.

1.30.6 In the case of Purchase of many items against one tender, which are not inter-dependent or, where compatibility is not a problem, normally the comparison would be made on ex-works, (in case of indigenous items) and on FOB/FCA (in case of imports) prices quoted by the firms for identifying the lowest quoting firm for each item.

1.30.7 Orders for imported stores need not necessarily be on FOB/FCA basis rather it can be on the basis of any of the Incoterms specified in ICC Incoterms 2000, as may be amended from time to time

by the ICC or any other designated authority and favourable to CSIR Labs./Institutes or Headquarters.

1.30.8 Wherever the price quoted on FOB/FCA and CIF/CIP basis are the same, the contract would be made on CIF/CIP basis only.

1.30.9 The GCC and the SCC shall specify the mode of transport i.e., whether by air/ocean/road/rail.

1.30.10 In case optional items are specified in the tendered specifications, the purchaser reserves the right to buy or not to buy the optional items. In case, the option is exercised to buy the optional items, after bid opening, then the cost of the optional items would be included to ascertain the lowest evaluated responsive bid. In case, the option is exercised not to buy the optional items, then the cost of the optional item(s) would not be included in ascertaining the lowest evaluated responsive bid.

Note: Bidders not quoting for the optional items entail the risk of their offer being summarily ignored on the event the purchaser decides to buy the optional items after tender opening.

1.31.0 Comparison of the bids

1.31.1 The Purchaser shall compare all substantially responsive bids to determine the lowest valued bid, in accordance with ITB Clause 1.30.

1.32 Contacting the Purchaser

1.32.1 Subject to ITB Clause 1.24, no bidder shall contact the purchaser on any matter relating to its bid, from the time of the bid opening to the time the contract is awarded.

1.32.2 Any effort by a bidder to influence the purchaser in its decisions on bid evaluation, bid comparison or contract award may result in rejection of the Bidder's bid.

1.33 Post qualification

1.33.1 In the absence of pre-qualification, the purchaser will determine to its satisfaction whether the bidder that is selected as having submitted the lowest evaluated responsive bid is qualified to perform the contract satisfactorily, in accordance with the criteria listed in ITB Clause 1.13.

1.33.2 The determination will take into account the eligibility criteria listed in the bidding documents and will be based upon an examination of the documentary evidence of the Bidder's qualifications submitted by the Bidder, as well as such other information as the Purchaser deems necessary and appropriate.

1.33.3 An affirmative determination will be a prerequisite for award of the contract to the Bidder. A negative determination will result in rejection of the Bidder's bid.

F AWARD OF CONTRACT

1.34 Negotiations

- 1.34.1 There shall not be any negotiation normally. Negotiations, if at all, shall be an exception and only in the case of item(s) with limited source of supply. Negotiations shall be held with the lowest evaluated responsive bidder. Counter offers tantamounts to negotiations and shall be treated at par with negotiations in the case of one time purchases.

1.35 Award Criteria

- 1.35.1 Subject to ITB clause 1.37, the purchaser will award the contract to the successful bidder whose bid has been determined to be substantially responsive and has been determined to be the lowest evaluated bid, provided further that the bidder is determined to be qualified to perform the contract satisfactorily. The details of the award would be hosted on the website of the purchaser.

1.36 Purchaser's right to vary Quantities at Time of Award

- 1.36.1 The purchaser reserves the right at the time of contract award to increase or decrease the quantity of goods and services originally specified in the schedule of requirements without any change in unit price or other terms and conditions. Further, at the discretion of the purchaser, the quantities in the contract may be enhanced by 30 per cent within the delivery period.

1.37 Purchaser's right to accept any bid and to reject any or all bids

- 1.37.1 The purchaser reserves the right to accept or reject any bid, and to annul the bidding process and reject all bids at any time prior to award of contract, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder or bidders.

1.38 Notification of Award

- 1.38.1 Prior to the expiration of the period of bid validity, the purchaser will notify the successful bidder in writing by registered letter or by cable or telex or fax or email that the bid has been accepted and a separate purchase order shall follow through post.
- 1.38.2 Until a formal contract is prepared and executed, the notification of award should constitute a binding contract.
- 1.38.3 Upon the successful bidder's furnishing of the signed contract form and performance security pursuant to ITB Clause 1.41, the purchaser will promptly notify each unsuccessful bidder and will discharge its bid security.

1.39 Signing of Contract

- 1.39.1 Promptly after notification, the purchaser shall send the successful bidder the agreement/PO.
- 1.39.2 Within 21 (twenty one) days of date of the agreement, the successful bidder shall sign, date, and return it to the purchaser.

1.40 Order Acceptance

- 1.40.1 The successful bidder should submit order acceptance within 15 (fifteen) days from the date of issue, failing which it shall be presumed that the vendor is not interested and his bid security is liable to be forfeited pursuant to clause 1.15.11 of ITB.
- 1.40.2 The order confirmation must be received within 15 (fifteen) days. However, the purchaser has the powers to extend the time frame for submission of order confirmation and submission of Performance Security (PS). Even after extension of time, if the order confirmation/PS is not received, the contract shall be cancelled and limited tenders irrespective of the value shall be invited from the responding firms after forfeiting the bid security of the defaulting firm, where applicable, provided there is no change in specifications. In such cases the defaulting firm shall not be considered again for re-tendering in the particular case.

1.41 Performance Security

- 1.41.1 Within 21 (twenty one) days of receipt of the notification of award/PO, the supplier shall furnish performance security (PS) in the amount specified in SCC, valid till 60 (sixty) days after the warranty period. Alternatively, the PS may also be submitted at the time of release of final payment in cases where part payment is made against delivery and part on installation. The PS, where applicable, shall be submitted in advance for orders where full payment is to be made on Letter of Credit (L/C) or on delivery. In this case, submission of PS at the time of negotiation of documents through bank would be stipulated as a condition in the L/C and the BS should be kept valid till such time the PS is submitted.
- 1.41.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete its obligations under the contract.
- 1.41.3 The performance Security shall be denominated in Indian rupees for the offers received for supplies within India and denominated in either the currency of the contract or in INR in the case of offers received for supply from foreign countries.
- 1.41.4 In the case of imports, the PS may be submitted either by the principal or by the Indian agent and, in the case of purchases from indigenous sources, the PS may be submitted by either the manufacturer or their authorised dealer/bidder.
- 1.41.5 The performance security shall be in one of the following forms:
- (a) A Bank guarantee or stand by Letter of Credit issued by a Nationalised/Scheduled bank located in India or a foreign bank with preferably its operating branch in India in the form provided in the bidding documents. Or
 - (b) A Banker's cheque or Account Payee demand draft in favour of the purchaser. Or,
 - (c) A Fixed Deposit Receipt pledged in favour of the Purchaser.
- 1.41.6 The performance security will be discharged by the Purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than 60 (sixty) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance

obligations, including any warranty obligations, unless specified otherwise in SCC, without levy of any interest.

- 1.41.7 In the event of any contract amendment, the supplier shall, within 21 (twenty one) days of receipt of such amendment, furnish the amendment to the performance security, rendering the same valid for the duration of the contract, as amended for further period of 60 (sixty) days thereafter.
- 1.41.8 The order confirmation should be received within 15 (fifteen) days from the date of notification of award. However, the purchaser has the powers to extend the time frame for submission of order confirmation and submission of Performance Security (PS). Even after extension of time, if the order confirmation/PS is not received, the contract shall be cancelled and limited tenders irrespective of the value would be invited from the responding firms after forfeiting the bid security of the defaulting firm, where applicable provided there is no change in specifications. In such cases the defaulting firm would not be considered again for re-tendering in the particular case.
- 1.41.9 Whenever, the bidder chooses to submit the Performance Security in the form of Bank Guarantee, he should advise the banker issuing the Bank Guarantee to immediately send by Registered Post (A.D.) an unstamped duplicate copy of the Guarantee directly to the Purchaser with a covering letter to compare with the original BG for the correctness, genuineness, etc.

2.1 Definitions

2.1.1 The following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:

- (a) “Contract”, means the Contract Agreement entered into between the Purchaser and the Supplier, together with the Contract Documents referred to therein, including all attachments, appendices, and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- (b) “Contract Documents”, means the documents listed in the Contract Agreement, including any amendments thereto.
- (c) “Contract Price”, means the price payable to the Supplier as specified in the Contract Agreement, subject to such additions and adjustments thereto or deductions there from, as may be made pursuant to the Contract.
- (d) “Day”, means calendar day.
- (e) “Completion”, means the fulfilment of the Related Services by the Supplier in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the Contract.
- (f) “GCC”, mean the General Conditions of Contract.
- (g) “Goods”, means all of the commodities, raw material, machinery and equipment, and/or other materials that the Supplier is required to supply to the Purchaser under the Contract.
- (h) “Related Services”, means the services incidental to the supply of the goods, such as transportation, insurance, installation, training and initial maintenance and other such obligations of the Supplier under the Contract.
- (i) “SCC”, means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- (j) “Sub-contractor”, means any natural person, private or government entity, or a combination of the above, to whom any part of the Goods to be supplied or execution of any part of the Related Services is subcontracted by the Supplier.
- (k) “Supplier”, means the natural person, private or government entity, or a combination of the above, whose bid to perform the Contract has been accepted by the Purchaser and is named as such in the Contract Agreement.
- (l) The “Council”, means the Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (CSIR), registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 of the Govt. of India having its registered office at No. 2, Rafi Marg, New Delhi - 110001, India and the “Purchaser”, means any of the constituent Laboratory/Institute of the Council situated at any designated place in India as specified in SCC.
- (m) “The final destination”, where applicable, means the place named in the SCC.

2.2 Contract Documents

2.2.1 Subject to the order of precedence set forth in the contract agreement, all documents forming the contract (and all parts thereof) are intended to be correlative, complementary, and mutually explanatory. The contract agreement shall be read as a whole.

2.3 Fraud and Corruption

2.3.1 The purchaser requires that bidders, suppliers, contractors and consultants, if any, observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of such contracts. In pursuit of this policy,

(a) The terms set forth below are defined as follows:

(i) “Corrupt practice”, means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution;

(ii) “Fraudulent practice”, means a misrepresentation or omission of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract;

(iii) “Collusive practice”, means a scheme or arrangement between two or more bidders, with or without the knowledge of the borrower, designed to establish bid prices at artificial, non competitive levels; and

(iv) “Coercive practice”, means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the procurement process or affect the execution of a contract;

(b) The purchaser will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the bidder recommended for award has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive or coercive practices in competing for the Contract in question;

2.4 Joint Venture, Consortium or Association

2.4.1 If the Supplier is a joint venture, consortium, or association, all of the parties shall be jointly and severally liable to the Purchaser for the fulfilment of the provisions of the Contract and shall designate one party to act as a leader with authority to bind the joint venture, consortium, or association. The composition or the constitution of the joint venture, consortium, or association shall not be altered without the prior consent of the Purchaser.

2.5 Scope of Supply

2.5.1 The Goods and Related Services to be supplied shall be as specified in Chapter-4 i.e. Specifications and allied technical details.

2.6 Suppliers’ Responsibilities

2.6.1 The supplier shall supply all the Goods and Related Services included in the Scope of Supply in accordance with Scope of Supply Clause of the GCC, and the Delivery and Completion Schedule, as per GCC Clause relating to delivery and document.

2.7 Contract price

2.7.1 Prices charged by the Supplier for the Goods supplied and the Related Services performed under the Contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the Supplier in its bid.

2.8 Copy Right

2.8.1 The copyright in all drawings, documents, and other materials containing data and information furnished to the Purchaser by the Supplier herein shall remain vested in the Supplier, or, if they are furnished to the Purchaser directly or through the Supplier by any third party, including suppliers of materials, the copyright in such materials shall remain vested in such third party.

2.9 Application

2.9.1 These General Conditions shall apply to the extent that they are not superseded by provisions in other parts of the Contract.

2.10 Standards

2.10.1 The goods supplied and services rendered under this contract shall conform to the standards mentioned in the technical specifications, and, when no applicable standard is mentioned, to the authoritative standard appropriate to the goods' country of origin and such standards shall be the latest issued by the concerned institution.

2.11 Use of Contract Documents and Information

2.11.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample or information furnished by or on behalf of the Purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the Supplier in performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far, as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.

2.11.2 The Supplier shall not, without the Purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information enumerated above except for purposes of performing the contract.

2.11.3 Any document, other than the contract itself, enumerated above shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.

2.12 Patent Indemnity

2.12.1 The Supplier shall, subject to the purchaser's compliance with GCC Sub-Clause 2.12.2 indemnify and hold harmless the purchaser and its employees and officers from and against any and all suits, actions or administrative proceedings, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, and

expenses of any nature, including attorney's fees and expenses, which the purchaser may suffer as a result of any infringement or alleged infringement of any patent, utility model, registered design, trademark, copyright, or other intellectual property right registered or otherwise existing at the date of the Contract by reason of:

- (a) the installation of the goods by the supplier or the use of the goods in India; and
- (b) the sale in any country of the products produced by the goods.

2.12.2 If any proceedings are brought or any claim is made against the purchaser, the purchaser shall promptly give the supplier a notice thereof, and the supplier may at its own expense and in the Purchaser's name conduct such proceedings or claim and any negotiations for the settlement of any such proceedings or claim.

2.13 Performance Security

2.13.1 Within 21 (twenty one) days of receipt of the notification of award/PO, the Supplier shall furnish performance security in the amount specified in SCC, valid till 60 (sixty) days after the warranty period. Alternatively, the PS may also be submitted at the time of release of final payment in cases where part payment is made against delivery and part on installation. The PS, where applicable, shall be submitted in advance for orders where full payment is to be made on Letter of Credit (L/C) or on delivery. In this case, submission of PS at the time of negotiation of documents through bank would be stipulated as a condition in the L/C and the BS should be kept valid till such time the PS is submitted.

2.13.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete its obligations under the contract.

2.13.3 The Performance Security shall be denominated in Indian Rupees for the offers received for supplies within India and denominated in the currency of the contract in the case of offers received for supply from foreign countries.

2.13.4 In the case of imports, the PS may be submitted either by the principal or by the Indian agent and, in the case of purchases from indigenous sources, the PS may be submitted by either the manufacturer or their authorised dealer/bidder.

2.13.5 The Performance security shall be in one of the following forms:

(a) A bank guarantee or stand by Letter of Credit issued by a Nationalised/Scheduled bank located in India or a bank located abroad in the form provided in the bidding documents.

Or

(b) A Banker's cheque or Account Payee demand draft in favour of the purchaser.

Or

(c) A Fixed Deposit Receipt pledged in favour of the Purchaser.

- 2.13.6 The performance security will be discharged by the Purchaser and returned to the Supplier not later than 60 (sixty) days following the date of completion of the Supplier's performance obligations, including any warranty obligations, unless specified otherwise in SCC, without levy of any interest.
- 2.13.7 In the event of any contract amendment, the supplier shall, within 21 (twenty one) days of receipt of such amendment, furnish the amendment to the performance security, rendering the same validity for the duration of the contract, as amended for further period of 60 (sixty) days thereafter.
- 2.13.8 The order confirmation should be received within 15 (fifteen) days from the date of notification of award. However, the Purchaser has the powers to extend the time frame for submission of order confirmation and submission of Performance Security (PS). Even after extension of time, if the order confirmation/PS is not received, the contract shall be cancelled and limited tenders irrespective of the value would be invited from the responding firms after forfeiting the bid security of the defaulting firm, where applicable provided there is no change in specifications. In such cases the defaulting firm would not be considered again for re-tendering in the particular case.
- 2.13.9 Whenever, the bidder chooses to submit the Performance Security in the form of Bank Guarantee, then he should advise the banker issuing the Bank Guarantee to immediately send by Registered Post (A.D.) an unstamped duplicate copy of the Guarantee directly to the Purchaser with a covering letter to compare with the original BG for the correctness, genuineness, etc.

2.14 Inspections and Tests

- 2.14.1 The inspections and test, training required would be as detailed in Chapter-4 of the Bidding Document relating to Specification and Allied Technical details.

2.15 Packing

- 2.15.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit and open storage. Packing case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 2.15.2 The packing, marking and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be provided for in the contract including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

2.16 Delivery and Documents

- 2.16.1 Delivery of the Goods and completion and related services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified by the Purchaser in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.
- 2.16.2 The terms FOB, FCA, CIF, CIP etc shall be governed by the rules prescribed in the current edition of the Inco terms published by the International Chambers of Commerce, Paris.
- 2.16.3 The mode of transportation shall be as specified in SCC.

2.17 Insurance

- 2.17.1 Should the purchaser elect to buy on CIF/CIP basis, the goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in Indian rupees against any loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in SCC up to the final destination i.e. CSIR-IICT Hyderabad.
- 2.17.2 Where delivery of the goods is required by the purchaser on CIF/CIP basis the supplier shall arrange and pay for Cargo Insurance, naming the purchaser as beneficiary and initiate and pursue claims till settlement, on the event of any loss or damage.
- 2.17.3 Where delivery is on FOB/FCA basis, insurance would be the responsibility of the purchaser.
- 2.17.4 With a view to ensure that claims on insurance companies, if any, are lodged in time, the bidders and/or the Indian agent shall be responsible for follow up with their principals for ascertaining the dispatch details and informing the same to the purchaser and he shall also liaise with the purchaser to ascertain the arrival of the consignment after clearance so that, immediately thereafter in his presence the consignment could be opened and the insurance claim be lodged, if required, without any loss of time. Any delay on the part of the bidder/Indian Agent would be viewed seriously and he shall be directly responsible for any loss sustained by the purchaser on the event of the delay.

2.18 Transportation

- 2.18.1 Where the supplier is required under the contract to deliver the goods FOB, transport of the goods, up to and including the point of putting the goods on board the vessel at the specified port of loading, shall be arranged and paid for by the Supplier, and the cost thereof shall be included in the contract price. Where the Supplier is required under the contract to deliver the goods FCA, transport of the goods and delivery into the custody of the carrier at the place named by the purchaser or other agreed point shall be arranged and paid for by the supplier, and the cost thereof shall be included in the contract price.
- 2.18.2 Where the supplier is required under the contract to deliver the goods CIF/CIP, transport of the goods to the port of destination or such other named place of destination in the purchaser's country, as shall be specified in the contract, shall be arranged and paid for by the supplier, and the cost thereof shall be included in the contract price.

2.18.3 In the case of supplies from within India, where the supplier is required under the contract to transport the goods to a specified destination in India, defined as the final destination, transport to such destination, including insurance and storage, as specified in the contract, shall be arranged by the Supplier, and the related costs shall be included in the contract price.

2.19 Incidental Services

2.19.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the services, including training, if any, specified in chapter-4.

2.20 Spare Parts

2.20.1 The Supplier shall be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

(a) Such spare parts as the Purchaser may elect to purchase from the Supplier, providing that this election shall not relieve the Supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and

(b) In the event of termination of production of the spare parts:

(i) Advance notification to the Purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the Purchaser to procure needed requirements; and

(ii) Following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the Purchaser, the blueprints, drawings and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

2.21 Warranty

2.21.1 The Supplier warrants that all the Goods are new, unused, and of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials, unless provided otherwise in the Contract.

2.21.2 The Supplier further warrants that the goods shall be free from defects arising from any act or omission of the Supplier or arising from design, materials, and workmanship, under normal use in the conditions prevailing in India.

2.21.3 Unless otherwise specified in the SCC, the warranty shall remain valid for thirty six 36 (thirty six) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the SCC, or for 42 (forty two) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the country of origin, whichever period concludes earlier.

2.21.3 The Purchaser shall give notice to the Supplier stating the nature of any such defects together with all available evidence thereof, promptly following the discovery thereof. The Purchaser shall afford all reasonable opportunity for the Supplier to inspect such defects.

2.21.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, within a reasonable period of time, expeditiously repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, at no cost to the Purchaser.

2.21.5 If having been notified, the Supplier fails to remedy the defect within a reasonable period of time, the Purchaser may proceed to take within a reasonable period such remedial action as may be necessary, at the Supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the Purchaser may have against the Supplier under the contract.

2.21.6 Goods requiring warranty replacements must be replaced on free of cost basis to the purchaser.

2.22 Terms of Payment

2.22.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the Supplier under this contract shall be as specified in the SCC.

2.22.2 The Supplier's request(s) for payment shall be made to the Purchaser in writing, accompanied by an invoice describing, as appropriate, the goods delivered and the Services performed, and by documents, submitted pursuant to delivery and document clause of the GCC and upon fulfilment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.

2.22.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the Purchaser but in no case later than 30 (thirty) days after submission of the invoice or claim by the Supplier.

2.22.4 Payment shall be made in currency as indicated in the contract.

2.23 Change Orders and Contract Amendments

2.23.1 The Purchaser may at any time, by written order given to the Supplier pursuant to clause on notices of the GCC make changes within the general scope of the contract in any one or more of the following:

- (a) Drawings, designs, or specifications, where goods to be furnished under the contract are to be specifically manufactured for the Purchaser;
- (b) The method of shipping or packing;
- (c) The place of delivery; and/or
- (d) The Services to be provided by the Supplier.
- (e) The delivery schedule.

2.23.2 If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time enquired for the Supplier's performance of any provisions under the Contract, an equitable adjustment shall be made in the Contract Price or delivery schedule, or both, and the contract shall accordingly be amended. Any claims by the Supplier for adjustment under this clause must be asserted within 15 (fifteen) days from the date of the Supplier's receipt of the Purchaser's change order.

2.23.3 No variation or modification in the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties.

2.24 Assignment

2.24.1 The Supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the Contract, except with the Purchaser's prior written consent.

2.25 Subcontracts

2.25.1 The Supplier shall notify the Purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contract if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the Supplier from any liability or duties or obligation under the Contract.

2.26 Extension of time.

2.26.1 Delivery of the Goods and performance of the Services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule specified by the Purchaser.

2.26.2 During the performance of the Contract, at any given point of time the Supplier or his subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may, at its discretion, extend the supplier's time for performance with or without penalty, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of the contract.

2.26.3 Except as provided under the Force Majeure clause of the GCC, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalty pursuant to penalty clause of the GCC unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to above clause without the application of penalty clause.

2.27 Penalty clause

2.27.1 Subject to GCC Clause on Force Majeure, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the Services within the period(s) specified in the Contract, the Purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as penalty, a sum equivalent to the percentage specified in SCC of the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services or contract value for each week or part thereof of delay until actual delivery or performance, up to a maximum deduction of the percentage specified in SCC. Once the maximum is reached, the Purchaser may consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause on termination for default. The SCC shall also indicate the basis for ascertaining the value on which the penalty shall be applicable.

2.28 Termination for Default

2.28.1 The Purchaser may, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, terminate the contract in whole or part

- (a) If the Supplier fails to deliver any or all the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the Purchaser pursuant to GCC clause on extension of time; or

- (b) If the supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract.
- (c) If the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent or collusive or coercive practices as defined in GCC clause on fraud or corruption in competing for or in executing the contract.

2.28.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, he may take recourse to any one or more of the following action:

- (a) The Performance Security is to be forfeited;
- (b) The purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, stores similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable for all available actions against it in terms of the contract.
- (c) However, the supplier shall continue to perform the contract to the extent not terminated.

2.29 Force Majeure

2.29.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses relating to extension of time, penalty and Termination for Default the Supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, liquidated damages or termination for default, if and to the extent that, its delay in performance or other failure to perform its obligations under the Contract is the result of an event of Force Majeure.

2.29.2 For purposes of this Clause, “Force Majeure”, means an event or situation beyond the control of the Supplier that is not foreseeable, is unavoidable, and its origin is not due to negligence or lack of care on the part of the Supplier. Such events may include, but not be limited to, acts of the Purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, and freight embargoes.

2.29.3 In case if a Force Majeure situation crops up, the supplier shall promptly notify the Purchaser in writing of such conditions and the cause thereof within 21 (twenty one) days of its occurrence. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

2.29.4 If the performance in whole or in part or any obligations under the contract is prevented or delayed by any reason of force majeure for a period exceeding 60 (sixty) days, either party may at its option terminate the contract without any financial repercussions on either side.

2.30 Termination for Insolvency

2.30.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier, if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy, which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

2.31 Termination for Convenience

2.31.1 The purchaser, by written notice sent to the supplier, may terminate the contract, in whole or in part, at any time. The notice of termination shall specify that termination is for the purchaser's convenience, the extent to which performance of the supplier under the contract is terminated, and the date upon which such termination becomes effective.

2.31.2 The goods that are complete and ready for shipment within 30 (thirty) days after the supplier's receipt of notice of termination shall be accepted by the purchaser at the contract terms and prices. For the remaining goods, the purchaser may elect:

- (a) To have any portion completed and delivered at the contract terms and prices; and/or
- (b) To cancel the remainder and pay to the supplier an agreed amount for partially completed goods and for materials and parts previously procured by the supplier.

2.32 Settlement of Disputes

2.32.1 The Purchaser and the supplier shall make every effort to resolve amicably by direct informal negotiation any disagreement or dispute arising between them under or in connection with the contract.

2.32.2 In case if the parties fail to resolve their dispute or difference in 21 (twenty one) days, by such mutual consultation, then either the Purchaser or the Supplier may give notice to the other party of its intention to commence arbitration, as hereinafter provided, as to the matter in dispute, and no arbitration in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given. Any dispute or difference in respect of which a notice of intention to commence arbitration has been given in accordance with this clause shall be finally settled by arbitration. Arbitration may be commenced prior to or after delivery of the goods under the contract.

2.32.3 The dispute settlement mechanism/arbitration proceedings shall be concluded as under:

- (a) In case of dispute or difference arising between the Purchaser and a domestic supplier relating to any matter arising out of or connected with this agreement, such disputes or difference shall be settled in accordance with the Indian Arbitration & Conciliation Act, 1996, the rules there under and any statutory modifications or re-enactments thereof shall apply to the arbitration proceedings. The dispute shall be referred to the Director General, Council of Scientific & Industrial Research and if he is unable or unwilling to act, to the sole arbitration of some other person appointed by him willing to act as such Arbitrator. The award of the arbitrator so appointed shall be final, conclusive and binding on all parties to this order.
- (b) In the case of a dispute between the purchaser and a foreign supplier, the dispute shall be settled by arbitration. In accordance with provision of sub-clause (a) above. But if this is not acceptable to the supplier then the dispute shall be settled in accordance with provisions of UNCITRAL (United Nations Commission on International Trade Law) Arbitration Rules.

2.32.4 The venue of the arbitration shall be the place from where the purchase order or contract is issued.

2.32.5 Notwithstanding any reference to arbitration herein,

- (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the Contract unless they otherwise agree; and
- (b) the Purchaser shall pay the Supplier any monies due the Supplier.

2.33 Governing Language

2.33.1 The contract shall be written in English language which shall govern its interpretation. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract, which are exchanged by the parties, shall be written in the English language only.

2.34 Applicable Law

2.34.1 The Contract shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Union of India and all disputes shall be subject to place of jurisdiction as specified in SCC.

2.35 Notices

2.35.1 Any notice given by one party to the other pursuant to this contract/order shall be sent to the other party in writing or by cable, telex, fax, e-mail or and confirmed in writing to the other party's address specified in the SCC.

2.35.2 A notice shall be effective when delivered or on the notice's effective date, whichever is later.

2.36 Taxes and Duties

2.36.1 For goods manufactured outside India, the Supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside India.

2.36.2 For goods manufactured within India, the Supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred till its final manufacture/production.

2.36.3 If any tax exemptions, reductions, allowances or privileges may be available to the supplier in India, the purchaser shall make its best efforts to enable the supplier to benefit from any such tax savings to the maximum allowable extent.

2.36.4 All payments due under the contract shall be paid after deduction of statutory levies (at source) like ESIC, IT, etc.) wherever applicable as per extant rules.

2.36.5 Excise Duty – If the supply is within India, this institute is exempted from payment of Excise Duty as per notification No.10/97 – Central Excise, dated 1st March, 1997.

Customs Duty – If the supply is from abroad this institute is permitted to import goods as per notification No.51/96 – Customs and pay a concessional duty up to 5 per cent as per notification 24/2002 – Customs on all imports.

2.37 Right to use Defective Goods

2.37.1 If after delivery, acceptance and installation and within the guarantee and warranty period, the operation or use of the goods proves to be unsatisfactory, the Purchaser shall have the right to continue to operate or use such goods until rectifications of defects, errors or omissions by repair or by partial or complete replacement is made without interfering with the Purchaser's operation.

2.38 Protection against Damage

2.38.1 The system shall not be prone to damage during power failures and trip outs. The normal voltage and frequency conditions available at site as under:

- (a) Voltage 230 volts – Single phase/ 415 V 3 phase (+_ 10%)
- (b) Frequency 50 Hz.

2.39 Site preparation and installation

2.39.1 The Supplier is solely responsible for the construction of the equipment sites in compliance with the technical and environmental specifications. The Purchaser will designate the installation sites before the scheduled installation date to allow the Supplier to perform a site inspection to verify the appropriateness of the sites before the installation of the equipment, if required. The supplier shall inform the purchaser about the site preparation, if any, needed for installation, of the goods at the purchaser's site immediately after notification of award/contract.

2.40 Integrity Pact

2.40.1 As per the directives of the Central Vigilance Commission all organisations including CSIR labs./institutes have to adopt an Integrity Pact (IP) to ensure transparency, equity and competitiveness in major public procurement activities. The integrity pact envisages an agreement between the prospective bidders/vendors with the buyer committing the persons/officials of both the parties with the aim not to exercise any corrupt influence on any aspect of the contract. Only those bidders/vendors who are willing to enter in to such an integrity pact with the purchaser would be competent to participate in the bidding.

2.40.2 Integrity Pact also envisages Panel of Independent External Monitors (IEMs) which shall be provided/recommended by CSIR/its labs and institutes with the approval of by CVC.

2.40.3 The integrity pact would be effective from the date of invitation of bids till complete execution of the contract.

2.40.4 The SCC shall specify whether there is a need to enter into a separate integrity pact or not. The model format of integrity pact (IP) is at Chapter-8.

2.41 Import and Export Licenses

2.41.1 If the ordered materials are covered under restricted category of Exim policy in India the vendor /agent may intimate such information for obtaining a necessary license in India.

2.41.2 If the ordered equipment is subject to vendor procuring an export license from the designated government agency/country from where the goods are shipped/sold, the vendor has to mention the name, address of the government agency/authority. The vendor must also mention the time period within which the license will be granted in normal course.

2.42 Risk Purchase Clause

2.42.1 If the supplier fails to deliver the goods within the maximum delivery period specified in the contract or purchase order, The purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such a manner as it deems appropriate, goods or services similar to those undelivered and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs incurred for such similar goods or services.

GCC 2.1.1(l)	The Purchaser is: The Director, CSIR-Indian Institute of Chemical Technology, Tarnaka, Uppal Road, Hyderabad: 500 007, Telangana, India.
GCC 2.1.1(m)	The final destination is: Indian Institute of Chemical Technology, Uppal Road, Tarnaka, Hyderabad: 500 007, Telangana, Republic of India.
GCC 2.13.1	The amount of the performance security shall be 10 per cent of the contract value.

INTEGRITY PACT

Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (CSIR) hereinafter referred to as “The Principal”.

Andherein referred to as “The Bidder/Contractor.”

Preamble

The Principal intends to award, under laid down organizational procedures, contract/s forThe Principal values full compliance with all relevant laws of the land, rules, regulations, economic use of resources and of fairness/ transparency in its relations with its Bidder(s) and/or Contractor(s).

In order to achieve these goals, the Principal will appoint an Independent External Monitor (IEM), who will monitor the tender process and the execution of the contract for compliance with the principles mentioned above.

Section 1 – Commitments of the Principal

Copy of the "Guidelines on Banning of business dealings" is annexed and marked as Annex -"B".

Section 4 – Compensation for Damages

- (1) If the Principal has disqualified the Bidder(s) from the tender process prior to the award according to Section 3, the Principal is entitled to demand and recover the damages equivalent to Earnest Money Deposit/ Bid Security.

- (2) If the Principal has terminated the contract according to Section 3, or if the Principal is entitled to terminate the contract according to Section 3, the Principal shall be entitled to demand and recover from the Contractor liquidated damages of the contract value or the amount equivalent to Performance Bank Guarantee.

Section 5 – Previous transgression

- (1) The Bidder declares that no previous transgressions occurred in the last 3 (three) years with any other Company in any country conforming to the anti corruption approach or with any other Public Sector Enterprise in India that could justify his exclusion from the tender process.
- (2) If the Bidder makes incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from the tender process or action can be taken as per the procedure mentioned in “Guidelines on Banning of business dealings”.

Section 6 – Equal treatment of all Bidders/Contractors/Sub-contractors

- (1) The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) undertake(s) to demand from all Subcontractors a commitment in conformity with this Integrity Pact, and to submit it to the Principal before contract signing.
- (2) The Principal will enter into agreements with identical conditions as this one with all Bidders, Contractors and Subcontractors.
- (3) The Principal will disqualify from the tender process all bidders who do not sign this Pact or violate its provisions.

Section 7 – Criminal charges against violating Bidders/Contractors/Subcontractors

- (1) The Principal appoints competent and credible Independent External Monitor for this Pact. The task of the Monitor is to review independently and objectively, whether and to what extent the parties comply with the obligations under this agreement.
- (2) The Monitor is not subject to instructions by the representatives of the parties and performs his functions neutrally and independently. He reports to the JS (A), CSIR.
- (3) The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) accepts that the Monitor has the right to access without restriction to all Project documentation of the Principal including that provided by the Contractor. The Contractor will also grant the Monitor, upon his request and demonstration of a valid interest, unrestricted and unconditional access to his project documentation. The same is applicable to Subcontractors. The Monitor is under contractual obligation to treat the information and documents of the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s)/Subcontractor(s) with confidentiality.
- (4) The principal will provide to the Monitor sufficient information about all meetings among the parties related to the Project provided such meetings could have an impact on the contractual relations between the Principal and the Contractor. The parties offer to the Monitor the option to participate in such meetings.

- (5) As soon as the Monitor notice, or believes to notice, a violation of this agreement, he will so inform the Management of the Principal and request the Management to discontinue or take corrective action, or to take other relevant action. The monitor can in this regard submit non-binding recommendations. Beyond this, the Monitor has no right to demand from the parties that they act in a specific manner, refrain from action or tolerate action.
- (6) The Monitor will submit a written report to the JS (A), CSIR within 8 to 10 weeks from the date of reference or intimation to him by the Principal and should the occasion arise, submit proposals for correcting problematic situations.
- (7) Monitor shall be entitled to compensation on the same terms as being extended to/provided to Independent Directors on the CSIR.
- (8) If the Monitor has reported to the JS (A), CSIR, a substantiated suspicion of an offence under relevant IPC/PC Act, and the JS (A), CSIR has not, within the reasonable time taken visible action to proceed against such offence or reported it to the Chief Vigilance Officer, the Monitor may also transmit this information directly to the Central Vigilance Commissioner.
- (9) The word 'Monitor' would include both singular and plural.

Section 9 – Pact Duration

This Pact begins when both parties have legally signed it. It expires for the Contractor 10 months after the last payment under the contract, and for all other Bidders 6 months after the contract has been awarded.

If any claim is made/lodged during this time, the same shall be binding and continue to be valid despite the lapse of this pact as specified above, unless it is discharged/determined by JS (A), CSIR.

Section 10 – Other provisions

- (1) This agreement is subject to Indian Law. Place of performance and Jurisdiction is the Registered Office of the Principal, i.e. New Delhi
- (2) Changes and supplements as well as termination notices need to be made in writing. Side agreements have not been made.
- (3) If the Contractor is a partnership or a consortium, this agreement must be signed by all partners or consortium members.
- (4) Should one or several provisions of this agreement turn out to be invalid, the remainder of this agreement remains valid. In this case, the parties will strive to come to an agreement to their original intentions.
